THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

Today's celebration has been known by several different names through the ages; most popularly perhaps, Candlemas.

The Feast of the Synaxis ("meeting") of Our Lord in the Temple. This ancient and alternative title of the feast reminds us that another name for the celebration of the Mass when we gather together is the sacred synaxis, the people meet one another but they also meet with their Lord.

The Purification of Mary is another former name for today's feast, reminding us that in accordance with Mosaic Law (Leviticus 12:1-8), forty days after the birth of a child the mother is required to present the her child originally in the Tabernacle, then later in the Temple once it had been built, and offer as a sacrifice either a lamb or a pair of doves or pigeons for her purification.

At one time in the Church there was the practice of blessing a woman after childbirth as, up to the sixth century, it was believed that a woman became ritually impure by giving birth; even within living memory there was a social custom of a mother "lying in" after childbirth.

A Catholic tradition and practice known as the "Churching of Women", more formally Benedictio mulieris post partum (the blessing of women after birth), focused rather on blessing and thanksgiving for a safe delivery and the gift of a child.
